**Rationale for the conference:**

Discrimination is not only a hugely important real-life issue. It is also a theoretically important and sophisticated field of research.

This conference is the second in an annual series of international CEPDISC conferences on discrimination. The conference series explores discrimination in general and discrimination from the perspective of social psychology and philosophy in particular.

The aim of the conference series is to facilitate the emergence of a large international research community that explores discrimination using the combination of two of the most powerful approaches in the academic toolbox: The philosophical analysis of concepts and the experimental analysis of data. We welcome all who are interested in either of these approaches and, in particular, who are curious and enthusiastic about their combination. Presentations that specifically explore this combination are particularly welcome at CEPDISC'22 but the conference is also very much open to a broader range of presentations on discrimination, e.g., to papers on discrimination employing the methods of legal theory or sociology.

**Host:**

The conference is hosted by the Centre for the Experimental-Philosophical Studies of Discrimination (CEPDISC) at Aarhus University, Denmark. CEPDISC is a newly established (August 2020) centre of excellence funded by the Danish National Research Foundation (2020-2027). The Centre Director is Professor Kasper Lippert-Rasmussen.

**Presentations:**

The conference call is open to paper presentations:

- Paper presentations: 30 minutes sessions (Q&A included).
- Poster presentations: All posters will be displayed throughout the conference and a solo session will be dedicated to poster presentations.

An abstract template is [available](#) for download on the conference website.

The abstract should contain the following information:

- A max 1000 (paper presentation) words abstract describing the content of the presentation.
- Font: Calibri. Font size: 12 point. Margin: top (3 cm), bottom (3 cm), left (2 cm), right (2 cm). The abstract should include title, authors (corresponding author: bold), addresses (italic and font size 10), and abstract body text
- Abbreviations, (in parentheses after the first full use of the word), should be used for common terms only. Write numbers as numerals rather than words.

- The abstract will appear exactly as typed. Therefore, any errors in spelling, grammar or scientific facts will be reproduced as you type them.
- Please note that by submitting your abstract to this conference, you agree that the abstract will be printed in the abstract book and published on the conference website.
- Please name your file the following way: last name\_first name(s)

**Deadline for submissions: June 6, 2022.** Response can be expected no later than June 30.

Conference fee: 2600 DKK (approx. 350 EURO)

PhD students (shared double room): 1800 DKK (approx. 242 EURO)

The conference fee includes:

- Breakfast Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday
- Lunch Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday
- Water, tea and coffee during the conference

- One scheduled pick up in Billund International Airport Sunday (presumably early evening exact time TBA), returning on October 26 (time TBA)
- One Scheduled pick up at Vejle Train and Bus Station Sunday (presumably early evening, exact time TBA), returning on October 26 (time TBA)

In case of Arrival Monday and accommodation is only needed for two nights (Monday, 24 October – Wednesday, 26 October) the conference fee is 2100 DKK (approx. 283 Euro) and for PhD students 1400 DKK (approx. 188 EURO).

Please notice the fee does not include access to the spa which can be purchased when signing up (295 DKK (approx. 40 Euro) for 3 hours (need to be scheduled 1 month in advance) or free access during the conference 495 DKK (approx. 67 EURO)).

Cancellation and refunds: Cancellation of in-person participation is possible up until July 23, 2022 with a full conference fee refund (please note that you might be subject to a transfer fee of up to 125 DKK (16-17 Euro)).

If it turns out after the registration deadline that we will not be able to go ahead with an in-person conference due to a national or regional lock down due to the Covid-19 pandemic, we will of course refund the full registration fee.
