The University of Cologne is one of Germany's largest universities and is funded through the German Excellence Initiative. The Institute of Sociology and Social Psychology (ISS) was established in 1919 as the first of its kind in Germany and has developed a strong tradition in theory-based empirical research ever since.

We invite candidates with a strong background in quantitative methods and statistics. Candidates with expertise in the analysis of longitudinal data and/or survey methodology, shown by a track record of publications in leading international journals, are particularly welcome. Candidates should ideally have a substantive interest in one of the ISS's main fields of research ("Demography and Social Inequality" or "Decision Making in Social Contexts").

Candidates are expected to offer courses in German or English at Bachelor and Master levels. They are also expected to participate in the Research Training Group "Social Order and Life Chances in Cross-national Comparison" (SOCLIFE), which is part of the Cologne Graduate School in Management, Economics and Social Sciences (CGS).

The qualifications expected are a university and Ph.D. degree, international experiences, and excellent academic achievements and teaching abilities.

The University of Cologne is an equal opportunity employer. Applicants with disabilities are treated with preference given comparable qualification. The University seeks to increase the number of women in research and teaching and thus strongly and explicitly encourages qualified female scholars to apply.
